Walks Around St Hilary - North West Circular -

10.8 miles – 4 hours – Strenuous – 5 pub stops

Overview

Compared to the other walks, this is a strenuous walk. It provides lots of lovely views as it tracks the rim of the land around Penllyn Moors. In total there is about 1,500 feet of ascent. In return, you will see a secret filming location of Doctor Who, find a hidden well and walk through castle grounds. There's no risk of getting too tired, as there are 5 pub stops along the route!

Distance

10.8 miles

Time

4.0 hours (brisk pace without stops)

Route

St Hilary – Aberthin – Llansannor – Penllyn – Cowbridge – St Hilary

Pub stops

Start and Finish (Bush Inn), Aberthin (Hare & Hounds and Farmers), Craig Penllyn (Barley Mow), Penllyn (Red Fox), Cowbridge (several)

Terrain

Over St Hilary Down and Stalling Down to start, then fields with stiles, a woodland walk up to Penllyn, a hidden country mansion and some secret back ways through Cowbridge before climbing back up to St Hilary. Good tracks and paths. Newton Farm can be muddy. Pen-y-lan can be overgrown. Three main ascents and descents.
